Clerk Thorson provided written approval from the DNR on shoreland changes to Ordinance 2022-06 Chapter 151.028 and Ordinance 2022-07 the Removal of Chapter 151.066. Storm Damage Firewood Harvest

Council discussed what should be done with the pile of debris and stumps that has accumulated from citizens dumping their storm damage trees and shrubs near the announcers stand. Member Hill was approached and was asked if it could be harvested. After discussion it was agreed it could be harvested only if the harvester signed a Waiver of Liability with City Hall. Mayor Grobeck spoke with Assistant Fire Chief Fleischauer asking the Ottertail Fire Department to burn the remaining pile in the fall.
